# Mark Charity in Action.....

#### **Community First Responders**

The Mark Province of Cheshire, in its drive to support charitable work in the community, is supporting a project known as "*MRAS First Responders Community Scheme*". The Province has already given £5,000, as the first of five annual payments of £5,000 to support the initiative.



Just what is the "First Responders" Scheme all about and where is it based?

The project is operated by the Merseyside Ambulance Service (MRAS) and committed to improving community based first aid skills. They have established a series of community first responder groups who provide the Trust with a community based first response to a range of 999 calls. They are linked to ambulance emergency control via pager and radio and operate in various parts of Cheshire and the Wirral. This scheme is managed by Steve Evans, First Responder Manager. Volunteering is a great way of developing new skills and learning from new experiences. It is an opportunity to meet friends, learn new skills or put experience to good use. It is also a chance to be part of a team that will make a difference to people's lives. In the Cheshire area the scheme is already operating in the following areas: Wirral, Nantwich, Congleton, Knutsford, Malpas, Poynton, Tarvin, Alsager and Tatton Hall.

Those participating receive training, support, expenses and basic equipment from the Ambulance Service – but others help with fund raising as this is the primary source of revenue.

#### So what do "First Responders" do?

They primarily respond to Heart Attack victims. Schemes consist of a team of trained volunteers who operate within a three mile radius of their home. The operational area is limited to ensure a rapid response. Team members are on 'standby duty' on a voluntary rota - equipped with a pager, radio, automatic external defibrillator and a trauma kit including oxygen equipment (as carried by MRAS paramedics). They cannot be contacted directly and are only licensed to respond once a 999 call has been made. The MRAS are solely responsible for the deployment of "First Responders" who work as an integral part of the Ambulance Service.



"First Responders" are easily recognised as they wear high-visibility jackets and MRAS uniform with the name – First Responder – and the MRAS logo prominently displayed. All responders carry an Official ID Card bearing their name and photograph.

# Deeside Mark Lodge ...... A New Banner!

On 23<sup>rd</sup> June 1923, members of Egerton Mark Lodge No. 165 held an emergency meeting at Birkenhead, to discuss the possibility of forming a new Lodge. Later that year, Deeside Mark Lodge No, 795 was consecrated.

The first mention of a new banner came at a meeting in February 1973, when the lodge was planning its silver jubilee celebration, but for unknown reasons, a banner did not materialise.

Early in 2005, the Secretary, W.Bro. Jim Hardman and the Senior Warden, Bro. Harry Fynn attended a dinner party. It was here that a banner was again suggested. As the party progressed that night, so did the ideas for designs, shapes and sizes and finally a decision was made. A photograph of the proposed design was subsequently submitted to Grand Lodge, via the Provincial office. Within a month it was approved; quickly followed a letter of congratulations.

After discussions with the maker, the Banner was delivered just four months later, to the delight of the two donors, W.Bro. Hardman and Bro. Fynn. The Provincial Grand Secretary was informed, who in turn made arrangements with the RW Provincial Grand Master to attend. He was accompanied by the Deputy and Assistant Provincial Grand Masters and the Provincial team, in order to dedicate and bless the new Banner.



On 29<sup>th</sup> March 2006, The Provincial Grand Master, RW Bro. Bryan R. Ogden, together with **135** other Mark Masons packed the Wallasey Masonic Hall to absolute capacity. Guided by the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies, W. Bro. Peter Dowell PAGDC, the Banner Bearer, Bro. Nikolas Miles Hardman, the son of the Lodge Secretary, proudly paraded the banner into the Lodge room (see photo), where the Dedication ceremony proved to be most interesting and enjoyable for all. The Provincial Grand Chaplain, W. Bro. Bruce Harry PAGChap rendered a most interesting oration which enriched the whole ceremony.

The design of the banner was taken from the Lodge logo, as depicted on the summons. On the left is a representation of the column which stands at the summit of Caldy Hill in West Kirby, commemorating those lost in the Great War, 1914-1918. In the centre is depicted the Old Lighthouse at Kings Gap, Hoylake. The Lighthouse acted a warning to shipping entering the Dee Estuary as the port was once very busy indeed. On the right is the 'Dee Mark', which is located at the mouth of the River Dee, as a marker indicating to shipping that they are leaving the Irish Sea and entering the Dee.

Deeside Mark is a vibrant lodge, having advanced over thirty brethren since the year 2000. It continues to work hard, both in lodge and for the Charities. We wish them well.

Held annually since 2003, the Grand Officers dinner was once again well attended when the Provincial Grand Master hosted the event at Cheshire View, Christleton, at the end of June.



# Consecration of the Cheshire Installed Commanders Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No. 1468

Early in 2005, the Provincial Grand Master, RW Bro Bryan Russell Ogden asked W.Bro. David R. Sellers RAMGR and W. Bro. William A. Chalmers RAMGR, to look into the possibility of founding a new Royal Ark Mariners Lodge - exclusively catering for Installed and Past Commanders. The idea was to allow senior members of the Province to meet and exchange ideas and innovations for the promotion and betterment of the degree in Cheshire. The principle was working very well in the Mark degree through the East Cheshire Lodge of MMM 1468 and the West Cheshire Lodge of MMM No 1497 – so why not for the Ark Mariners Degree.



Following much consultation and planning, it was at a meeting of the East Cheshire Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 1468 on 11<sup>th</sup> November 2005, when W.Bro. William A. Chalmers PGJD, the newly installed Worshipful Master rose. He gave a brief description of events, formally proposing that the East Cheshire Mark Lodge be the sponsoring lodge for the new Installed Commanders Royal Ark Mariner Lodge, which was to be founded in May 2006. This was seconded by W.Bro. David R. Sellers PGJD and approved with acclaim by the assembled brethren.

And so the foundations of the new Lodge were laid, the efforts of which came to fruition on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> May 2006, at Cheshire View, Christleton. On this date over one hundred brethren joined with Provincial leaders and thirty nine founders to consecrate the Cheshire Installed Commanders Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No. 1468.

At 6pm exactly, the Consecrating Officer, RW Bro. Bryan Russell Ogden, entered the Lodge and took the chair. Following salutations and prayers, he explained the reasoning behind the consecration. The Petitioners formed up in the East to hear the Warrant read by the Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. Peter E. Carroll PAGDC. Following a most interesting Oration by the acting Provincial Grand Chaplain, W. Bro. B. S. Raby, the Consecrating Officer, assisted by the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies, W. Bro. Peter J. Dowell PAGDC, perambulated the lodge scattering the emblems of abundance, plenty, joy, gladness, peace and harmony. Completing the ceremony, the consecrating officer dedicated and consecrated the new lodge.

The Installation of the Primus Commander saw W.Bro. David Robinson Sellers RAMGR, ably installed into the chair by the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. David Alldred RAMGR. Following the appointment and investiture of the officers, the Lodge was closed and the brethren retired.

The event concluded with good food and company at an excellent festive board which saw the dining room filled to capacity. We wish the members of the new Lodge well for the future.
