Grand Lodge celebrates its 150th Anniversary in style.....

Thursday October 26th 2006 was one of the most memorable dates in the history of the Mark Degree in living memory. On this date over 6000 Mark Masons, wives, partners, and friends made the journey to London to participate in the Celebration of 150 years of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons. So great was the support for the event that the Albert Hall was filled to capacity, and additional accommodation had to be found at Freemason's Hall.

The Province of Cheshire was very well represented at the event, with over 160 brethren and partners making the journey South. On the day before the main celebration, executive coaches were organised from Christleton and Timperley to transport the Cheshire contingent, many of whom took advantage of the 'competitively priced' accommodation offer at the Bedford Hotel.

During the evening of Wednesday October 25th, a magnificent dinner was held at the Guildhall for Senior Mark Masons, at which the Provincial Grand Master, RW Bro. Bryan Russell Ogden, VW Bro. Timothy Richards Grand Master Overseer and W Bro. Paul Bullows Grand Steward were privileged to be present.

The main celebration took place during the afternoon of Thursday 26th October, when brethren from all over the world, dressed in full regalia, joined their partners in an

afternoon of pageantry, music, speeches, and a wonderful demonstration of that often unsung aspect of our freemasonry charity. The majority of the Cheshire group were seated together in the gods; however, there were two large projector screens



above the stage which enabled the proceedings to be viewed with great clarity. The proceedings were also transmitted 'live' to those at Great Queen Street. The event began with a procession of acting Grand Officers, followed by the Provincial and District Grand Masters, Heads of other Masonic Orders, the Duke of Kent, Grand Master of the United Grand Lodge of England, accompanied by the Pro Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master and Assistant Grand Master for the Craft, and finally with the Most Worshipful Grand Master, HRH Prince Michael of Kent, accompanied by the Pro Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, and Assistant Grand Master taking centre stage. Princess Michael of Kent was evident in the Royal box. (A comment was made during one of the formal speeches referring to the array of gold present as 'Masonic bling'!) To see unity so much in evidence among the various orders was a delight. An opening address and prayer was followed by a musical interlude provided by The Royal Masonic School for Girls. RW Bro. James Daniel then gave a witty and expertly illustrated talk on Masonic Founders and Builders - a very detailed presentation of some of those influential and active Mark Masons, without whom a 150th celebration might not have happened.

To further mark the event, the five founding lodges (Bon Accord, Royal Cumberland Lodge of MMM, Northumberland and Berwick upon Tweed Lodge of MMM, Old Kent Dinner at the Guildhall, London Lodge, and Phoenix Lodge of Mark Masters) were presented with new banners. The banners were then paraded and dedicated. At this point in the proceedings, the principal guest arrived - HRH the Duchess of

Cornwall, who was present in her capacity as President of the National Osteoporosis Society. A cheque was then presented by the President of the General Board, to the Society for £3 million for the purchase of Mobile Osteoporosis Scanners (which equates to around £70 from each Mark Mason -Ed). This is the largest single donation ever made by the Mark Benevolent Fund since its inception in 1868.

The celebration closed with the National Anthem and outgoing parade. Those brethren who were watching at Great Queen Street were later treated to a visit from the Prince Michael of Kent and the other leaders of the Order, which was a very welcome surprise. The brethren who attended received a commemorative programme, breast jewel, book of lectures, and a Mark token and the ladies, a scarf – wonderful reminders of a fantastic occasion.

On the Thursday evening, 80 brethren and their partners joined a dinner at the Imperial Hotel, which was attended by our own leaders. Overall a hugely The presentation of the cheque for £3 million



successful event, with some poignant and very happy memories. Our grateful thanks go to W.Bro's David Heathcote and Paul Bullows who organised the transport, accommodation and dining for the brethren of Cheshire.

Celebrating 75 years at Middlewich Mark Lodge!

On 27th November 2006 the brethren of Middlewich Lodge of Mark Master Masons No 902 were joined by our Provincial Grand Master, RW Bro. Bryan Russell Ogden and the full Provincial team to celebrate the Lodges's 75th Anniversary. It was a full house and a very enjoyable occasion, made even more special by the added celebration of W.Bro. Malcolm Clerc's 50 years in Mark Masonry which came with a most amusing explanation of how his family named was derived!

Our Provincial Grand Master took the chair and delivered a warm and most interesting oration reflecting on some interesting past history together with hearty good wishes for the future. There were 57 brethren present at the 3.45pm Consecration meeting of the Lodge held on Saturday 7th November 1931 at Kinderton Street, Middlewich. R.W. Bro. Cuthbert Leicester Warren then PGM was in attendance and V.W. Bro George Leigh JP PGO DepPGM proceeded to Install W.Bro Evanson PPrAGDC as Worshipful Master. Dinner was priced at the princely sum of 10/6!

There were only 7 founder members, none of whom were actually from Middlewich however, W.Bro Evanson and his officers advanced no less than 12 Brethren in their first year, most of whom were members of Middlewich 's Avondale Craft Lodge No 2389. From 1932, Mark Lodges were encouraged to become Keystone Lodges, which Middlewich MMM Lodge achieved in 1940. Between 1932 and 1945, a further 20 brethren were Advanced however, the Lodge does not record many visitors in attendance probably due to WW2 and during the war years there were no festive boards held.

Since 1932, the Lodge has gone from strength to strength and now boasts some 50 members and is currently the largest Mark Lodge in the Province of Cheshire, saving the flagship lodges of East and West Cheshire.

The brethren are proud to have contributed considerable funds to the Mark Benevolent Fund and have an abundance of Mauls presented by our PGM on numerous occasions. One such PGM visit was to celebrate W.Bro Ken Davies's feat of walking from John o' Groats to Lands End at the same time raising £ 2700 for the Fund!

Since 2000 the Lodge has attracted a candidate for Advancement at every meeting or, put another way, one candidate for every meeting this century. Proud of their history and traditions, they are looking to the future with confidence and are always on the look out for worthy Craft candidates.

We are indebted to the Lodge Secretary, W.Bro Reg Jackson PPrGSwdBr, for supplying us with this most interesting history of Middlewich Lodge of MMM. (*Thank you Reg—Ed*).

The entertainment was provided by Nigel Ogden and the Altrincham Choral Society. Nigel of course, is a very well known organist, presenting regularly on Radio 2's *The Organ Entertains*. The quality of the music was superb, and enjoyed by all - how do you make a church organ sound like a Wurlitzer? — and the rendition of the programme devised by both Nigel Ogden and the Choir was more than just simply music, it was entertainment of the highest order.

CHESTER CATHEDRAL

The story of Chester Cathedral can be traced back to the time of the Saxon Minster, which in 907 housed the remains of St. Werburgh. During the period 1092 to 1540 the Benedictine Abbey of St Werburgh flourished on the same ground. The story continues with the foundation of a Cathedral for Chester Diocese by Henry VIII in 1541, and on to today. As a result, the present building contains materials belonging to every Christian century since the tenth, including a plentiful assortment of Masons' Marks!
