The Degree of the Ancient and Honourable Fraternity of Royal Ark Mariners

This ancient degree, the earliest confirmed working being 1790, has been under the jurisdiction of The Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons since 1871 and is governed by The Grand Masters Royal Ark Council. The Degree is only conferred on Mark Master Masons and further develops the Initiatory rite; that of a new start or outlook on life. It is based on the story of Noah building the Ark to preserve mankind from the Great Flood. Each Royal Ark Mariner Lodge is attached to a Mark Lodge and will bear the same number but not necessarily the same name. Like the Mark Degree there is only one ceremony, that of Elevation, which has some beautiful portions of ritual, guaranteed to make a lasting impression on every candidate.

Cheshire has 23 RAM Lodges, a full list of which can be found on the Cheshire Mark Masons web site, together with the places of meeting. Some Lodges meet on the same night as the Mark Lodge to which they are attached and share a social board, others meet separately. Members of the Degree are easily identified by the Rainbow Jewel they wear with their Mark regalia, the rainbow being the sign of the Degree. The Leaders of the Degree at Grand and Provincial level are the same as those in the Mark. A Lodge is headed by a Worshipful Commander. Ranks for members are solely Brother, Past Commander, RAM Provincial Grand Rank and RAM Grand Rank.



The Members of the RAM Lodges have always been represented at the Province of Cheshire Mark

meeting by a delegation of Commanders and you will have seen this small piece of ceremony at the start of the meeting when you have attended. The Order is still represented in this way at the Mark Provincial Meeting but now also holds its own RAM Assembly each January to confer Provincial Ranks and to allow the Provincial Grand Master to address the Assembly on matters of particular importance to members of the Order. Of the Mark Masons in Cheshire a little under half are also members of the RAM Degree and thoroughly enjoy it. If you have never taken the step from Mark Masonry into the RAM Degree please talk to one of the members of your Mark Lodge who wears the Rainbow Jewel and find out more about this beautiful Degree.

A Banner for the Order

With the Annual Assembly now well established, the Provincial Grand Master has proposed that the Order in Cheshire has its own Banner which should be distinct from that of the Mark Degree and depict the essentials of the Order and the symbols of Cheshire. He has asked for design ideas for this new banner, which any brother of an artistic bent is invited to submit to one of the Provincial Leaders before the end of May 2010. It is hoped that a banner can be made in time for dedication and use at the 2011 Assembly.

Cheshire Installed Commanders Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners 1468

In 2006 this Lodge was consecrated with the aim of promoting the degree in Cheshire and allowing Past Commanders of different Lodges to meet together, exchange ideas and receive lectures and demonstrations relevant to the order. The Lodge meets at Knutsford on the 4th Wednesday of May and September, the installation being in May. Our Provincial Grand Master initiated the move to form the Lodge and he is keen to see its membership extended to all Past Commanders who would like to participate.

The Grand Master's Lodge of Instruction Team is to visit the Lodge on Wednesday 22nd September 2010 to demonstrate the ceremony of Elevation. This is a most important visit for the Lodge to receive and all RAM Masons are invited to attend, you are assured of a great evening. Booking is on a first come first served basis as space is limited. The fee for dining is £14.50 and a cheque to "Cheshire Installed Commanders Lodge" will secure your place. 2010 Provincial Meeting - Another Great Success

The 2010 meeting of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Cheshire meeting was held on 13th February at the Town Hall, Ellesmere Port. The meeting was well supported by 221 Mark Masons from our Province, plus 41 distinguished guests from other Provinces

The Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master, Bro. Bryan Russell Ogden made recruitment the central message of his address to an attentive audience at the meeting. With the new Provincial Grand Master in the Craft, RWBro. Steven Adcott, attending the meeting for the first time, and sitting just a few feet away, he emphasised that it was just as important for the Mark brethren to seek to increase numbers in their Craft lodges as it was in their Mark and RAM lodges. As he reported on an Order that he said was "buoyant," he spoke of strong recruitment in both the Mark and RAM Degrees, but warned that with resignations above the long term average, the Order had suffered a further erosion in membership and urged Almoners to offer advice and support to those brethren whose attendance was starting to tail off; however he went on to stress that a strong membership in the Craft was an essential ingredient in building for the future.

"Whilst it goes without saying that recruitment is crucial to our future, it is crucial that we must also recognise that the lifeblood of this Degree is the membership of the Craft," he commented. "Many Craft masons have yet to join our ranks and there remains a considerable latent potential. But as you all know the Craft in the Province has suffered a substantial loss of membership over the past years and as a result that potential has been somewhat diminished. I can do no more than ask that whilst you continue to ensure the future of your Lodges, you will also give the utmost support to

our new R. W. Provincial Grand Master in his desire to "Grow Freemasonry in Cheshire" during his stewardship; for only by doing so will we acquire increased opportunities to secure growth in the Mark."

Having earlier referred to an "irrepressible enthusiasm," in the Order, he added that he and his Deputy and Assistant had been impressed by the attitudes in the Lodges that they had visited during 2009. He said: "There is an old homily that 'our prospects are transformed by our own attitudes.' So it is with the environment within our Lodges; enthusiasm is infectious. It has been gratifying therefore to witness your enthusiasm revealed in the quality of your work. I am left in no doubt that we all recognise that a high degree of fulfilment and enjoyment is the reward of Lodge membership."

He also registered his pleasure at the continued backing from the membership in the cause of charity – "The generosity of your support of our Charity is truly exceptional for since its inception (the Cheshire Provincial Mark Benevolent Fund) the fund has received nearly £300,000 from Mark and RAM Lodges throughout the Province; a truly remarkable achievement and on behalf of the Fund I thank you all for your beneficence. Seemingly undeterred by the prevailing economic environment, our Charity has enjoyed a very good year. An increase of income has enabled it to award

grants to a value well in excess of the previous year, whilst the recovery of a grant previously made but not utilised has facilitated the support of two very worthy Cheshire causes, namely Claire House and Francis House Children's Hospices who, between them, received grants totalling in excess of £20,000.It is only when you witness the emotion and joy with which our grants are received that you truly understand how important they are to these hard pressed organisations."

The RW Provincial Grand Master encouraged members to submit applications for grants – both Masonic and non-Masonic – wherever they saw a need and reminded the brethren that the Mark Medical Consultation Scheme, set up to aid brethren unable to afford initial private consultations to reduce time between GP referral and hospital treatment, was available to all members.

Prior to investing the new officers for 2010, he took a moment to thank VWBro. John Brian Haslam, the retiring Provincial Grand Chaplain, and WBro. Keith Rogerson, who was stepping down from the office of Organist, adding that "he wished WBro. Rogerson every success in his forthcoming role as Assistant to the Provincial Grand Principals in the Royal Arch."

The organising committee must again be praised for their efforts. The shuttle service operation to and from the Civic Centre at Ellesmere Port ran like clockwork as usual and the arrangements at the Hall were first class. Following the meeting 150 brethren returned to Ellesmere Port Masonic Hall where they enjoyed an excellent meal, to round off a day that truly reflected the tenets of Freemasonry.

Doric Mark Lodge

Many Cheshire Mark Masons will be aware of the recent success of Wythenshawe Mark Lodge which recently became a very successful 'daylight' Lodge. The concept of creating a similar Lodge on the Eastern side of the Province has been under consideration for some time and a proposal is now in place to move the Doric Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 792 from Stockport to become a daylight Lodge, meeting at Hyde.

No decision has yet been made on the day or time of the proposed meeting. If there is sufficient interest a meeting will be arranged to further the project in due course.
